



ENHANCED SAFETY AT YMCA CAMP WAPSIE



COMMUNICATION

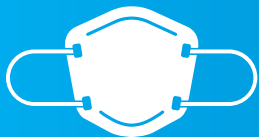
- Wapsie will email families proposed changes and enhancements to our program.
- Wapsie will notify registered camp families of enhanced screening and check in procedures prior to arrival at camp.

HEALTH, SAFETY & SCREENING

- Families will be asked to sign a waiver acknowledging the risk of COVID-19 and camp programming.
- Wapsie encourages campers to practice social distancing and self-monitoring 2 weeks prior to their session.
- Initial onsite health screenings will be performed before campers enter camp buildings.
- Campers with a high risk of complications from COVID-19 infection, or who are living with a high risk individual are recommended to not attend camp this summer. Consult your physician with questions.
- Each camper and staff member will have daily temperature and symptoms checks.



- Anyone on site that exhibits COVID-19 symptoms or has a fever of over 100.4° F will be quarantined on camp until a parent or guardian can take them home.
- Parent/guardians will be asked to pick up sick or exposed campers ASAP to minimize the risk of spread.
- Meals will be served and eaten in shifts with spacing between groups. Food will be served by staff to minimize contact.
- Campers and staff will practice social distancing as much as possible. Many activities will be done in smaller cabin/ program groups.



CHECK IN/CHECK OUT

- Families will be asked to limit bringing non-campers to check in and pick up times.
- Check in and pick up times will be staggered, families will be advised of camper's times.
- Social distancing will be practiced in camp and program groups for camp activities.
- Facemasks will be asked to be worn at check in/out and encouraged when social distancing is difficult, except when sleeping, swimming and eating. Parents should pack a couple facemasks for their child to have available at camp.



CLEANING & SANITIZING

- Living areas will be sanitized at least twice daily and between groups. Other buildings will have increased cleaning and sanitization procedures depending on usage.
- Campers and staff will have regular access to hand washing and/or sanitizing supplies.
- Additional handwashing and sanitation stations are being added to camp and program areas/equipment will be sanitized regularly or between groups.



These are examples of the many guidelines designed to help prevent the spreading of COVID-19 while still providing an opportunity for campers to participate in the positive benefits of a summer camp experience. These guidelines are subject to be updated if conditions or recommendations from the State of Iowa Health Department, CDC, Linn County Health Department and American Camping Association change.
